Our History

Founded in 1949 by Dr. Harold Wentz in downtown Rochester, Olmsted Medical Center started as a solo medical practice. In 1955, the establishment expanded with the inauguration of Olmsted Community Hospital. This hospital, originally county-affiliated, underwent a significant transformation in 1996 when it joined forces with Olmsted Medical Center, leading to its current designation as Olmsted Medical Center—Hospital.

Who We Are

Olmsted Medical Center (OMC) is southeastern Minnesota's integrated community healthcare provider best known for its convenient, quality personal care. OMC has over 1,500 healthcare professionals, serving at over 25 locations, and offers more than 35 specialties. A not-for-profit organization, Olmsted Medical Center cares for patients regardless of their ability to pay, and in 2025 made community contributions totaling \$101,145,865 (31.67% of total operating expenses).

What We Do

- With 297 clinicians and 1,526 staff, OMC provides healthcare services at 25 locations:
- Multi-specialty outpatient clinics in northwestern Rochester, southeastern Rochester, and Owatonna
- Walk-in Acute/Urgent care clinics
- Physical/occupational therapy/sports medicine and athletic performance facility
- A Level IV trauma hospital licensed for 61 beds with a 24-hour emergency department as well as a Women's Health Pavilion offering services including diagnostic radiology/mammography, plastic surgery, gynecology services, urogynecology, perinatology, and birthing services in our BirthCenter
- Primary care branch clinics in 12 southeastern Minnesota communities (Byron, Cannon Falls, Chatfield, Lake City, Owatonna, Pine Island, Plainview, Preston, Spring Valley, St. Charles, Stewartville, and Wanamingo)

OMC was among the first healthcare providers in the United States to:

- become an incorporated and accredited medical group
- offer an employee retirement plan
- employ professional administrators and a medical director
- computerize its business systems
- open branch clinics in neighboring communities
- have an organized quality improvement program
- establish a patient education department

- create a tobacco-free campus—the first in the state of Minnesota.
